LONDON SYMPHONIA'S SEASON OPENER HITS ALL THE RIGHT NOTES IN A NIGHT OF FIRSTS



OPENING NIGHT: TCHAIKOVSKY AND GOOD Saturday, October 5, 2024 at 7:30 p.m

LONDON, September 24, 2024 – London Symphonia is pulling out all the stops for its season opener with 50 musicians on stage performing two emotionally powerful works: Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 6 (known as the Pathétique) and Composer-In-Residence Scott Good's Trumpet Concerto, *Between The Rooms.* Daniel Bartholomew-Poyser, host of CBC's Centrestage and a good friend of London Symphonia, returns to conduct this exciting journey. (Saturday, October 5, at 7:30 p.m., Metropolitan United in London, ON.)

Adam Zinatelli, one of Canada's finest trumpet players, will make his debut with London Symphonia in the orchestra's first performance of *Between The Rooms*. Cinematic in scope and filled with driving rhythms and a wide pallet of orchestral colours, the concerto ignites the imagination.



"This concert is an incredible emotional journey that will be breathtaking to experience live in the concert hall," said Andrew Chung, "Tchaikovsky's stunning Symphony No. 6 has so many memorable tunes that audiences will be sure to recognize. We are delighted to perform it in the glorious acoustic of Metropolitan United."

This performance of Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 6 is one for the record books. It will be the first time that London Symphonia will perform a symphony by the great composer.

Concertgoers can choose to attend the concert in person at Metropolitan United, home of London Symphonia, or virtually through high quality 4K HDR Video On Demand productions that include 21 days of unlimited access.

ABOUT DANIEL BARTHOLOMEW-POYSER

Canadian conductor, Daniel Bartholomew-Poyser consistently brings clarity and meaning to the concert hall fostering deep connections between the audience and performers. In 2022, Daniel made his Carnegie Hall debut where he conducted the world premiere of "Ram Tori Maya" by Reena Esmail and "We Shall Not Be Moved" arranged by Nathalie Joachim. Currently, Daniel holds the positions of Resident Conductor of Engagement and Education at the San Francisco Symphony and the Barrett Principal Education Conductor and Community Ambassador of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra. In addition, he is also the Creative Partner with the National Arts Centre Orchestra in Ottawa.



ABOUT ADAM ZINATELLI

Praised as "exemplary" and "a superior trumpet player" (Calgary Herald), Adam Zinatelli is accomplished as an orchestral player, soloist, and chamber musician. Principal Trumpet of the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra since 2009 and guest principal trumpet with the National Arts Centre Orchestra and Les Violons du Roy, Adam is a founding member of the Canadian National Brass Project and the Reveille Trumpet Collective, a group dedicated to commissioning and performing new music for trumpet. He has also appeared in recital and chamber music performances at the Ottawa Chamber Music Festival, Toronto Summer Music Festival, Festival of the Sound, Sound Symposium New Music Festival, the Banff Centre, and the University of Calgary.

ABOUT SCOTT GOOD

Scott Good is a composer, conductor, concert designer and trombonist whose music is driven by the desire to create beauty, evoke emotion, and play with groove. As Composer-In- Residence with London Symphonia (2015-present) and the Vancouver Symphony (2008-2011), he has composed numerous orchestral works and orchestral arrangements. His most recent project is the premiere of *Lasker-Schüler Songs* composed for rising star soprano Midori Marsh and London Symphonia (2024), and two silent film scores: *The Passion of Joan of Arc* for a mixture of voices and period instruments to be premiered by Ensemble Caprice in Montreal (2026), and a two-and-ahalf hour score for large orchestra and chorus accompanying the epic silent film classic *Metropolis* with the Kingston Symphony, celebrating the film's 100th anniversary (2027).
